The Institute for Education is accepting applications submitted online as from **16:30 hrs of 14 May 2025** for the part-time blended-learning course *Master of Science in Addressing Adolescents with Divergent Behaviour* (MQF Level 7, 90 ECTS) starting in September 2025. Applications will be on a first-come first-served basis and limited to the first six (6) eligible applicants.

Course Details

This postgraduate programme offers a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach to understanding and addressing the complex challenges associated with adolescents displaying divergent behaviour. This programme provides an in-depth exploration of various facets crucial to effectively engage, support, and rehabilitate adolescents exhibiting such behaviour. Through a multidisciplinary approach, the programme emphasises the development of practical strategies for prevention, intervention, advocacy, and support for this vulnerable population within various settings, including schools, community organizations, and juvenile justice systems. It aims to equip practitioners working with Adolescents with Divergent Behaviour such as educators, social workers, youth workers, and other similar professionals with advanced skills to address the unique challenges posed by adolescents exhibiting divergent behaviour.

Applicants following this programme will have the possibility to exit with a:

- Postgraduate Certificate in Addressing Adolescents with Divergent Behaviour (upon completion of 30 ECTS)
- Postgraduate Diploma in Addressing Adolescents with Divergent Behaviour (upon completion of 60 ECTS)

Minimum entry requirements

Applicants are required to be in possession of the following:

1. A Bachelor's degree (MQF Level 6 with a minimum 180 ECTS) or higher in education, social work, youth work, probationary studies, psychology, criminology, sociology, social studies or a cognate area deemed relevant by the Institute for Education.

Applicants awaiting results for qualifications requested under the minimum entry requirements (with the exception of MQF Level 3 qualifications) or applicants in possession of a qualification conferred following an administrative pass, may be accepted as Probationary Course Participants. These applicants will be required to provide proof that they are currently awaiting first-sitting results and consequently provide proof of successful attainment of these results by no later than the 5th September 2025.

Language Requirement for Students from countries other than Malta

In addition to the above requirements, applicants whose mother tongue is not English, and who have never followed a full qualification taught in English language are required to demonstrate English language proficiency with an Academic IELTS score of 6.5, or an equivalent score from another recognised international proficiency examination.

Technological Requirements

All accepted course participants must ensure that they have a strong internet connection and a working microphone and camera for synchronous (live) online sessions.

Fieldwork Placement

To corroborate the theoretical aspects of this programme, this course also includes two (2) structured fieldwork modules, each comprising of 90 hours of practical fieldwork placement, per academic year. The placement will take place within reputed institutions experienced with dealing with adolescents exhibiting divergent behaviour. This component will be spread across a number of months.

Student Agreement

Accepted applicants will be required to endorse a Student Learning Agreement. The purpose of this agreement is to define the conditions of acceptance to undertake studies at the IfE. By signing the agreement both the IfE and the course participant will be agreeing to the stipulated conditions defining the relationship for the duration of studies.





Fees


Upon receiving the acceptance letter by the Institute, applicants from countries in the European Union (EU), Switzerland and countries in the European Economic Area (EEA) are required to pay €950 per academic year.

International applicants who are not from the EU, Switzerland or from a country within the EEA are required to pay in full the total cost of the course; €5,000.
