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DEEP Project Brief

Objective:

The DEEP project aims to foster a culture of democratic participation and empowerment within school communities by engaging educators, school leaders, students and families. It aims to develop a whole-school framework that nurtures critical thinking, collaboration, and civic engagement. A digital toolkit will be developed to translate the framework into practical resources that enable educators and school leaders to implement participatory decision-making processes effectively in school communities.

Implementation:

The DEEP project will develop a whole-school democratic framework with partner schools through an action research approach. It will provide guidance for the whole school community, equipping them with strategies to foster critical thinking and participation of all members of the school community. Overall, the project has 5 objectives:

1. Design an Inclusive Whole-School Programme and Toolkit - DEEP will develop a structured framework and toolkit that enables educators, students, and families to participate in democratic school governance. It will be developed, tested and refined in cooperation with the partner schools based on an action research approach, ensuring adaptability and responsiveness to different educational needs.
2. Empower Educators and School Leaders - DEEP will support partner schools and co-create a framework and toolkit that will foster the adoption of democratic education, participatory leadership, and critical thinking to equip educators and school leaders with tools to foster inclusive decision-making and collaborative problem-solving.
3. Strengthen Family-School Partnerships - DEEP will engage parents as active stakeholders in school governance, reinforcing shared responsibility in education. It will develop practical guidelines and resources to support meaningful parent-educator collaboration.
4. Promote Intercultural Awareness and Social Inclusion - DEEP will implement activities that foster dialogue, respect for diversity, and social cohesion. It will ensure participation of students from underrepresented backgrounds, creating equitable opportunities for civic engagement.
5. Ensure Replicability and Sustainability - The project will develop digital toolkits, training resources, and policy recommendations that can be adapted by other schools across Europe. It will also support partner schools in developing effective practices and sharing their experiences.
